FOREIGN TAX IDENTIFICATION NUMBER



As a U.S. financial institution, BIENESTAR Federal Credit Union is required to report the foreign tax identifying number (FTIN) of its members annually to the IRS using the 1042-S form.

If you are completing the Form W-8BEN as a non-U.S. taxpayer, the form must include your foreign tax identifying number (FTIN) to be deemed complete. Your foreign tax identifying number is issued to you by the country where you pay taxes.

If you cannot provide a foreign tax identifying number (FTIN) on your W-8BEN, you will have to provide an Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) to open or maintain an account with us.

Como una institución financiera establecida en Estados Unidos, la Cooperativa de Crédito de la Bienestar está obligada a reportar anualmente el número de identificación de impuestos extranjero (FTIN) de sus socios al Servicio de Impuestos Internos (IRS) utilizando el formulario 1042-S.
